

CHIEF MASTER SERGEANT BENNIE L. BELLVIN JR.

Chief Master Sergeant Bennie L. Belvin is the Command Chief Master Sergeant at the 147th Attack Wing, Texas Air National Guard, Ellington Field Joint Reserve Base, Houston, Texas. He develops measures of mission execution, ensures operational effectiveness, and advises senior leaders on the readiness, welfare, and proper utilization of Airmen. Additionally, he ensures the commander's directions and policies are carried out, and Airmen have a shared understanding of the commander's priorities and expectations and are dedicated to the mission of the command.

The Command Chief enlisted in the Active Duty Air Force in June 2001 as a Command and Control Apprentice. Upon graduation from basic military training, he attended technical training school at Keesler Air Force Base, Mississippi. His first duty station was Keflavik Naval Air Station, Iceland, where he was the Deputy Training Manager and Air Defense and Search and Rescue Controller. In October 2003, he was transferred to Kadena Air Base, Japan, and deployed to Karshi Khanabad, Uzbekistan, where he managed airfield operations, coordinated DV travel in the region, and managed troop transport in support of Operation ENDURING FREEDOM. Chief Bellvin made his final transfer to Ghedi Air Base, Italy, after his deployment. He received an honorable discharge after serving on active duty for six and a half years. In December 2007, Chief Bellvin enlisted in the Texas Air



National Guard as an Active Guard Reservist in the Command and Control Operations Senior Controller role. As an Active Guard Reservist, Chief Bellvin maintained command and control certifications and readiness and was accountable to wing and NORAD leaders for developing Airmen and leading air defense and emergency operations in support of Operation NOBLE EAGLE, a 24/7, NO FAIL Homeland Defense Mission. Chief Bellvin has also served as an Additional Duty First Sergeant, assisting commanders in caring for Airmen. Prior to his current position, Chief Bellvin was the Senior Enlisted Leader for the 147th Mission Support Group, Ellington Field Joint Reserve Base, Houston, Texas.

Chief Bellvin is also an EPME instructor and a previous Airman Leadership Seminar course leader, and he has served as vice president and president of the Texas Senior Enlisted Advisory Council where he led senior leaders convening as a collective board advising the Texas Deputy Adjutant General for Air. He has also been an active member of the local economy as the CEO of a real estate investment company. Chief Bellvin contributed research to the Higher Education and veteran communities, highlighting the unintended administrative policy effects of the Post-9/11 GI Bill; the first study of its kind.
