COLONEL TRAVIS D. WALTERS

Colonel Travis D. Walters is the Wing Commander, 147th Attack Wing, Texas Air National Guard, Ellington Field Joint Reserve Base, Houston, Texas. He is responsible for organizing, training, equipping, and maintaining combat ready forces for rapid deployment and employment on wartime missions with more than 1,080 citizen-Airmen for MQ-9 Reaper worldwide attack and reconnaissance operations, Joint Terminal Attack Control, and Expeditionary Combat Support missions.

Col Walters graduated from the United States Air Force Academy in 1999 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Military History. After completing Euro-North Atlantic Treaty Organization Joint Jet Pilot Training, he remained at Sheppard Air Force Base, Texas, as a T-37 Instructor Pilot, then transferred to Dyess Air Force Base, Texas, as a C-130 Aircraft Commander. Next, he served in a variety of staff positions at 18th Air Force, Air Mobility Command, and the Headquarters Air Force's National Guard Bureau. In 2013, after serving 14 years in the Air Force active component, Col Walters transferred to the Texas National Guard, eventually serving as the 136th Maintenance Squadron Commander. Col Walters then transitioned to Joint Forces Headquarters-Texas, Camp Mabry, Texas where he held multiple joint assignments culminating in his designation as a Level III Joint Qualified Officer.



Prior to his current position, Col Walters served as the Vice Commander, 147th Attack Wing, Texas Air National Guard, Ellington Field Joint Reserve Base, Houston, Texas.
